## INTRODUCTION

Named after the 19<sup>th</sup> century Philanthropist Muhammad Mohsin, Government Hazi Muhammad Mohsin College, Chattogram (Bengali: সরকারিহাজীমুহাম্মদ মহসিনকলেজ, চট্টগ্রাম) is a renowned government educational institution in Chattogram. The college, one of the oldest colleges in the country, has a century-old legacy.

Under the auspices of the 'Mohsin Fund' formed by the "Waqf-state" of Hazi Muhammad Mohsin, the college was established in 1874 as Chittagong Madrasah. In 1915, Madrasah education underwent a remarkable change and in 1918 a change named as New Scheme Madrasah came into force to strengthen Madrasah education. Chittagong Madrasah housed in Portuguese Building gradually developed into Islamic Intermediate College in 1927 to ensure higher education for the students. In 1967 Government Higher Secondary College was founded at the foot of the hill while Islamic Intermediate College was housed in the Portuguese Building. On 20 July 1979, through the merging of Islamic Intermediate College and Government Higher Secondary College Government Hazi Muhammad Mohsin College came into existence. At present, Hazi Muhammad Mohsin College is a pioneer co-education college providing quality education for the students belonging to higher secondary and tertiary levels.








Graph: Male-Female Ratio at the Honours Level
